# South Metropolitan TAFE Horticulture & Landscaping Industry Advisory Group

Training and upskilling have been a focus for your LIAWA Board. As such the Board is currently contributing three members to the recently established South Metropolitan TAFE Horticulture & Landscaping Industry Advisory Group.

The Horticulture & Landscaping Industry Advisory Group (IAG) provides information and advice to ensure that South Metropolitan TAFE's workforce development services are aligned with the current and future workforce needs of industry, used to inform the operational priorities of the Science and Environment Training Centre. By providing representation for our members on the IAG, LIAWA is working to provide better training options for the next generation of landscapers, landscape designers and horticulturalists.

The Industry Advisory Group are tasked with providing information and advice in the context of the following:

- industry workforce development needs which impact the delivery of training services;
- workforce development services, employment trends and their impact on the delivery of workforce development;
- opportunities for collaboration with industry in applied research and development and other business development activities related to training services and products;
- opportunities to improve outcomes for key client groups;
- identify critical customer groups and facilitate linkages with each group;
- review the course options and learning objectives of nominated courses to ensure their relevance to, and support from, industry and other key stakeholders (range of qualifications offered, unit selections, and methods of service delivery);
- establish a view of the future that guides the application and evolution of current and emerging technologies, cultural shifts, policy impacts, trade trends and new knowledge, and
- promote the national training framework and industry participation in nationally recognised training packages

As part of the consultation process, South Metropolitan TAFE will be looking for feedback on the various training packages developed (at a national level), and the courses that are scoped for delivery at SM TAFE. #### What's in the news?

The Albanese government is introducing extensive workplace changes, impacting gig workers and labour hire regulations, with an estimated cost of \$9 billion over a decade.

Critics argue the legislation is overly complex and centralizes wage setting, while proponents insist it addresses corporate loopholes and benefits workers.

## 'Same job, same pay' laws

- Labour hire workers must be paid at least the same as what a site's direct workforce gets paid in their enterprise agreement
- Laws will have a threemonth 'surge exemption'
- A multi-factor test aims to exempt specialist services contractors

## **Casual reforms**

Regular casuals will have a right to convert from casual to permanent every six months

## **Gig economy laws**

- Gig workers to get minimum pay and conditions on apps and online marketplaces if 'employee-like'
- Gig workers can be 'employee-like' if paid at or less than what an employee would get
- New test to allow contractors and gig workers to relitigate whether they are really employees

who deliberately

will face up to 10 years
jail and fines of up to
\$7.8m or three times the
amount of underpayment

## **Truck drivers**

The FWC would set minimum rates and conditions for owner-drivers, guided by an industry advisory body

# **Union rights**

Powers for union officials to talk to workers & conduct snap inspections of members' pay records without notice if they suspect underpayments Industry-tailored rights for union delegates and protections against employers refusing to deal with them


HARD TO STOMACH

Australian engineers have found a way to give used coffee a "double shot" at life as part of a breakthrough technique to create stronger concrete. Lead author Rajeev Roychand from RMIT University said they could make concrete 30 per cent stronger by turning waste coffee into biochar — a form of charcoal — using a process without oxygen at 350C.
